Example model for reflection (E-article - MA Healthcare) Critical Reflection - Academic Skills Advice Critical reflection means regularly identifying and exploring our own thoughts, feelings, and experiences and then making a decision about how they fit in with the ideas, concepts, and theories that you are aware of, learning more about or others have been discussing and sharing. What is critical reflection for early childhood educators? Critical self-reflection is thought to play an important role in facilitating student transitions (Brockbank and McGill 2007) and is closely linked with the

development of higher-order thinking skills (Fisher, 2003). Transition Skills and Strategies Student self-reflection is found to be one of the top indicators positively impacting student achievement in educational researcher John Hattie's highly regarded study Visible Learning. It is viewed as an important approach for professionals who embrace lifelong learning (Jasper, 2013). In general terms, reflective practice is the process of learning through and

from an experience or activity to gain new understandings of self and/or practice (Bout et al., 1985; Jasper, 2013).
